**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 24 authorizes retail spirits licensees to sell spirits if licensees operate within 2 miles of the city limits of a town with a population over 20,000 people.

The ABLE Commission is unable to estimate the fiscal impact. It is unknown how many business owners in the state are interested in locating a retail spirit outside of city limits. The Commission states they would have to create a new price point for this license, and it is possible the Commission could incur software costs.
