Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB 3 defines sludge and biosolid material and establishes a moratorium on sludge and biosolid and material until July 1, 2028. The bill directs the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to not issue any new permits for land applications of sludge or biosolid material, and permit renewals to be left to the discretion of the DEQ. The proposal requires permit holders to reduce the amount of material lan applied at least 25% by September 1, 2025, and reduce the amount of material land applied at least 50% by September 1, 2026. Permit holders are also required to submit a plan for full cessation to the DEQ, and directs the Department to promulgate rules.

The Department states that the committee substitute will not change the fiscal impact from the introduced version of the bill.
