**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 500 would require each governmental entity entering into a contract with a company for the purchase of goods or services to obtain written verification from the company that it does not have a practice or policy that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association and that it will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association. This provision shall not apply to an entity that did not receive a bid from an entity that could provide such written verification or contracts with a sole-source provider. The provisions of this measure shall apply to contracts with at least \$100,000.00 in value and are between a governmental entity and a company with at least 10 FTEs. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) estimates an additional FTE will be needed to implement the provisions. Added costs such as increased contract rates or the need for additional certified procurement officers for individual agencies are currently unknown.
