**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 613 directs the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) to establish a centralized statewide hotline for the reporting of water quality concerns, in coordination with the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to investigate complaints and conduct water quality sampling, testing, and enforcement as necessary.

The OAG believes there would be a minimum fiscal impact of \$125,000. They believe the proposal would require one complaint representative to coordinate referrals to the DEQ, hotline fees, and licensing fees for databases to log and monitor complaints (approximately \$1,300 per user per year for Aciss).

The DEQ currently operates an active toll-free complaint hotline, as required under 27A O.S. 2-3-202 (A)(15).
