**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 855 would lower the monetary threshold for the total amount of stolen goods to qualify an individual convicted of larceny for a felony from \$1,000 to \$500. The Department of Corrections notes any incarceration increases would be dependent on the number of future convictions, and the agency is unable to determine a fiscal impact. The Department has provided the marginal/incremental cost of housing an inmate, which is \$21.26 per day or \$7,759.90 per year.
