**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 887 directs the Department of Corrections to establish a 5-year pilot program designated as the Secure Pre-Integration Pilot Program. The program shall provide re-integration assistance to offenders incarcerated for non-violent offenses. The measure requires the program to address a comprehensive plan to release an inmate to his or her family, church, or community non-profit. The family or community entity responsible for such released inmate shall monitor the person and make regular reports to the Department of Corrections. The measure also creates the Secure Pre-Integration Pilot Program Revolving Fund and authorizes the Department to retain 5% of the fund for the administration of the program. The Department is unable to determine the overall savings or cost of the program, however the Department notes the most expensive cost associated with the program is the supervision of the inmate, which would be done by an outside entity. This could greatly reduce the incarceration costs to DOC per inmate that participates in the program. The current incremental incarceration cost per inmate is \$21.26 per day or \$7,759.90 per year. The program has the potential to fund itself through the associated savings of incarceration costs.
