L 4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:									
L5	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified									
L 6	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 28-104 of Title 70, unless there									
L7	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:									
L8	A. Private schools accredited by the State Board of Education									
L 9	or another accrediting association shall not, as a condition of									
20	acceptance, enrollment, or student eligibility, require that a									
21	student's parent or guardian participate in the Oklahoma Parental									
22	Choice Tax Credit Program created in Section 28-101 of Title 70 of									
23	the Oklahoma Statutes.									

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Students whose parents or quardians receive an income tax credit through the Oklahoma Parental Choice Tax Credit Program shall be provided with a tuition and fees agreement from the private school upon acceptance and enrollment. The agreement shall include the standard base tuition and fees rate for the student during their continued enrollment at the private school, provided that the school shall be allowed reasonable increases in the tuition rate or fees, limited to a standard inflation measure as calculated by the State Treasurer each July 1 by taking the average of the previous twelve available months' local consumer index ratings. Increases in tuition rate or fees shall be communicated, in writing through the normal means of school communication to parents and guardians, no less than one (1) school semester prior to the increase. provision of this section shall not apply to the tuition and fees of students attending private schools who are not receiving an income tax credit through the Parental Choice Tax Credit Program.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
