9	An Act relating to poultry feeding operations; authorizing the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture,
10	Food, and Forestry to suspend certain construction and operation on newly registered or licensed poultry
11	feeding operations; providing exception; authorizing Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and
12	Forestry to conduct certain inspection; requiring Department to cease registration or licensure under
13	certain circumstance; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for codification; and providing an
14	effective date.

16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 10-9.4a of Title 2, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. Beginning on the effective date of this act, the Oklahoma
21	Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall suspend the
22	construction or operation of poultry feeding operations registered
23	for less than one (1) year of operation or that have undergone a
24	transfer of ownership within one (1) year of operation until such

time as the Department determines compliance with all poultry
 feeding operation rules and regulations.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to existing 3 Β. poultry feeding operations that have been in continual operation for 4 5 more than one (1) year after the effective date of this act; provided, however, the Department shall be authorized to review, 6 inspect, or investigate existing poultry feeding operations, and, if 7 such review, inspection, or investigation results in a penalty 8 pursuant to Section 10-9.11 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the 9 Department shall issue a cease and desist order of the violating 10 poultry feeding operation by notice pursuant to Section 10-9.11 of 11 Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Department shall not reissue 12 13 a registration for any operation whose certification was revoked pursuant to this subsection. 14

15 C. The Department shall promulgate any rules necessary to16 implement the provisions of this section.

17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 20-44a of Title 2, unless there 19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Beginning on the effective date of this act, the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall suspend the construction or operation of new concentrated animal feeding operations licenses for persons engaging in poultry feeding operations for which registration is not required pursuant to

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subsection B of Section 10-9.3 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes
licensed for less than one (1) year of operation or that have
undergone a transfer of ownership within one (1) year of operation
until such time as the Department determines compliance with all
concentrated animal feeding operations rules and regulations.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to existing 6 в. concentrated animal feeding operations licenses for persons engaging 7 in poultry feeding operations who have been in continual operation 8 9 for more than one (1) year after the effective date of this act; provided, however, the Department shall be authorized to review, 10 inspect, or investigate existing concentrated animal feeding 11 12 operations for persons engaging in poultry feeding operations, and, 13 if such review, inspection, or investigation results in the finding of a violation of the provisions of Section 20-61 of Title 2 of the 14 Oklahoma Statutes, the Department shall revoke the license of such 15 individuals engaging in the poultry feeding operation pursuant to 16 Section 20-61 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Department 17 shall not reissue a license for any operation whose license was 18 revoked pursuant to this subsection. 19

C. The Department shall promulgate any rules necessary toimplement the provisions of this section.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.

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
