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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.1 of Title 59, unless there
17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
19	Community Health Worker Act".
20	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.2 of Title 59, unless there
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	As used in the Oklahoma Community Health Worker Act:
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1. "Certified community health worker" means a community health worker to whom the State Department of Health has issued a certificate to practice as a certified community health worker in this state;

- 2. "Community health worker" means a frontline health worker who has a shared understanding of and is a trusted member of the community being served; and
  - 3. "Department" means the State Department of Health.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.3 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The State Department of Health shall establish a certificate for community health workers. This certification shall be voluntary.
  - B. A certified community health worker may:
- 1. Serve as a liaison between health and social services and the community, including faith-based organizations, to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery;
- 2. Assist in identifying and communicating gaps in current community and health care resources; and
- 3. Build individual and community capacity by increasing health knowledge and self-sufficiency through a range of activities such as

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1 outreach, community education, coaching, mentoring, social support,
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- 2 | and advocacy, including efforts within faith-based settings.
- 3 | SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 4 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.4 of Title 59, unless there
- 5 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. To be eligible to apply for voluntary community health
- 7 | worker certification, an individual shall:
  - 1. Be a United States citizen or lawful permanent resident;
  - 2. Be a resident of this state;
    - 3. Be at least eighteen (18) years of age; and
- 4. Meet the minimum qualifications for certification
- 12 promulgated by the State Commissioner of Health under Section 5 of
- 13 this act; provided, however, the applicant shall be exempt from such
- 14 minimum qualifications if the applicant has provided evidence to the
- 15 | State Department of Health of work experience as a community health
- 16 | worker demonstrating a minimum of one thousand (1,000) practical
- 17 | hours and a recommendation from a supervising provider.
- 18 | SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.5 of Title 59, unless there
- 20 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 21 The State Commissioner of Health shall promulgate rules
- 22 | necessary to implement this act including, but not limited to, rules
- 23 that:

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1 1. Adopt a set of standards for the approval of certified 2 community health worker initial coursework or curriculum; 3 2. Establish examination administration requirements for the State Department of Health or one or more designees; 4 5 3. Define minimum qualifications for applicants to be certified; 7 4. Establish the criteria for granting, renewing, denying, suspending, and revoking a certificate to uphold health standards 9 and safety; and 5. Prescribe fees for the certified community health worker 10 examination, initial certification, and certification renewal. 11 SECTION 6.
