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6	An Act relating to fire departments; amending 11 O.S. 2021, Section 29-102, which relates to activity
7	reports from city fire departments; directing that reports utilize the National Emergency Response
8	Information System; directing reports to be completed within forty-eight hours of incident; directing
9	certain charitable corporations to submit reports utilizing the National Emergency Response Information
10	System; providing report contents; requiring reports to be submitted within forty-eight hours of incident;
11	amending 19 O.S. 2021, Section 901.7a, which relates to activity reports from fire protection districts;
12	directing fire chief to utilize the National Emergency Response Information System; requiring
13	reports be completed within forty-eight hours of incident; providing for codification; and providing
14	an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2021, Section 29-102, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Section 29-102. All cities having a paid fire department shall
21	have one full-time fire chief who shall supervise and administer the
22	fire department in accordance with the policies and procedures
23	prescribed by the governing body or by the city manager. The fire
24	department shall be under the direction and control of the fire

1 chief who shall not serve as fire chief and also as police chief, 2 city manager, mayor or any other position that impairs the ability to perform the duties of a fire chief. The fire chief, whether 3 permanent or interim, of any paid municipal fire department shall 4 5 have had at least three (3) years' actual experience as a paid fire fighter before assuming the position of fire chief. It shall be the 6 7 duty of the fire chief to file the appropriate activity report forms reports utilizing the National Emergency Response Information System 8 9 (NERIS) with the Office of the State Fire Marshal in Oklahoma City 10 on an annual basis. The activity report forms shall be designed by 11 the State Fire Marshal and shall include, but not be limited to, the 12 amount of property and vehicle fire loss, types of fires, 13 inspections and investigations that occurred. The report shall 14 include notification of all fire-related civilian deaths and 15 injuries in the respective jurisdiction and of fire fighter deaths 16 in the line of duty and of fire fighter injuries in the line of duty 17 requiring the services of a hospital or physician or both, and these 18 fire-related burn injuries and death reports shall be completed 19 within forty-eight (48) hours of the incident.

20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 595 of Title 18, unless there is 22 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any charitable corporation formed in an unincorporated area for the purpose of providing either a volunteer or a full-time fire

1 department, such as mentioned in Section 592 of Title 18 of the 2 Oklahoma Statutes, shall be required to file the appropriate activity reports utilizing the National Emergency Response 3 4 Information System (NERIS) with the Office of the State Fire Marshal 5 in Oklahoma City. The activity report forms shall include, but not be limited to, the amount of property and vehicle fire loss, types 6 7 of fires, inspections, and investigations. The report shall include notification of all fire-related civilian deaths and injuries in the 8 9 respective jurisdiction and of firefighter deaths in the line of 10 duty and of firefighter injuries in the line of duty requiring the 11 services of a hospital or physician or both, and these fire-related 12 burn injuries and death reports shall be completed within forty-13 eight (48) hours of the incident.

14SECTION 3.AMENDATORY19 O.S. 2021, Section 901.7a, is15amended to read as follows:

16 Section 901.7a. All Fire Protection Districts having more than 17 two full-time paid firefighters shall have one full-time fire chief 18 who shall supervise and administer the fire protection district in 19 accordance with the policies and procedures prescribed by the board 20 of directors. The fire protection district shall be under the 21 direction and control of the fire chief. The fire chief, whether 22 permanent or interim, of any paid or combination fire protection 23 district shall have had at least three (3) years actual experience 24 as a paid firefighter before assuming the position of fire chief.

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During the initial transition from a volunteer fire protection district to one having more than two full-time firefighters, the paid fire chief shall have had at least three (3) years of experience as a paid firefighter or at least five (5) years of experience as a volunteer fire chief officer with that department before assuming the position of paid fire chief. The board may add additional requirements to the position as necessary.

8 1. The fire chief:

- 9 a. shall be at the head of the department, subject to the 10 laws of the State of Oklahoma, rules of the board of 11 directors and the rules and regulations herein 12 adopted,
- b. shall be held responsible for the general condition
 and efficient operation of the department, the
 training of members and the performance of all other
 duties imposed upon him or her by law or the board of
 directors,
- c. may inspect or cause to be inspected by members of the
 department, the fire hydrants, cisterns and other
 sources of water supply at least twice a year,
- d. shall maintain a library or file of publications on
 fire prevention and fire protection and shall make use
 of the library or file to the best advantage of all
 members,

- e. shall make every effort to attend all fires and direct
 the officers and members of the fire department in the
 performance of their duties,
- f. shall see that the citizens are kept informed on fire
 hazards within the boundaries of the department and on
 the activities of the department,
- g. shall see that each fire is carefully investigated to
 determine its cause, and in the case of suspicion of
 incendiarism shall notify proper authorities. The
 fire chief shall secure and preserve all possible
 evidence for future use in the case of a suspicious
 incendiarism, and
- 13 h. shall file the appropriate activity report forms 14 reports utilizing the National Emergency Response 15 Information System (NERIS) with the Office of the 16 State Fire Marshal in Oklahoma City on an annual 17 basis. The activity report forms shall be designed by 18 the State Fire Marshal and shall include, but not be 19 limited to, the amount of property and vehicle fire 20 loss, types of fires, inspections and investigations. 21 The report shall include notification of all fire-22 related civilian deaths and injuries in the respective 23 jurisdiction and of firefighter deaths in the line of 24 duty and of firefighter injuries in the line of duty

1	requiring the services of a hospital or physician or
2	both, and these fire-related burn injuries and death
3	reports shall be completed within forty-eight (48)
4	hours of the incident.
5	2. Assistant fire chief. In the absence of the fire chief, the
6	assistant fire chief on duty shall command the department and be
7	held responsible therefore in all respects with the full powers and
8	responsibilities of the fire chief.
9	3. Company officers. The company officers shall be selected
10	upon their ability to meet the following requirements:
11	a. knowledge of firefighting,
12	b. leadership ability, and
13	c. knowledge of firefighting equipment.
14	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
