13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2021, Section 6-313, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 6-313. A. All catfish, minnows, fingerlings, fish,
17	frogs, and other aquatic species which are legally produced,
18	pursuant to the provisions of this act Sections 6-311 through 6-317
19	of this title, shall be confined to the lands and waters of the
20	licensee in such a manner so as to prohibit:
21	1. Contact with wild fish or other aquatic species in public
22	waters; and
23	2. Such wild fish or other aquatic species in from being
24	commercially harvested from public waters from and becoming a part

1 of the commercial production sold as a wild-born commodity. As used
2 in this paragraph, "wild-born" means wild fish or aquatic species
3 born in public waters and not introduced though aquaculture.

B. 1. Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, the
Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall not
restrict the manner in which persons, licensed pursuant to this act
<u>Sections 6-311 through 6-317 of this title</u>, gather or impound
aquatic species raised within the impoundments in their commercial
operations.

2. No person shall sell or attempt to sell game fish and/or 10 paddlefish obtained from public waters that have been commingled 11 12 with privately produced fish subject to the provisions of this act 13 Sections 6-311 through 6-317 of this title regarding the capture of wild fish or aquatic species for direct sale. A licensed producer 14 may collect both game fish and nongame fish broodstock from public 15 waters using any legal means of take for use in propagation of fish 16 17 only in a recirculating aquaculture system up to, but not exceeding, the normal possession limit for a person holding a recreational 18 fishing license; provided, that the licensed producer complies with 19 all applicable terms set forth by the Department of Wildlife 20 Conservation. Additionally, such individual broodstock may not be 21 sold and cannot be released back into the wild. Production of fish 22 species considered to be species of special concern, excluding 23 paddlefish (polyodon spathula), along with species prohibited under 24

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1 agency rules and federal threatened and endangered species, is
2 prohibited.

3	C. No licensee may receive, free of charge, any catfish,
4	minnow, fingerling, fish, frog or other aquatic species from the
5	state or federal government Meat and any other finished products for
6	human consumption that result from fish spawned in a captive system
7	may be sold in this state or out of state; provided, that the
8	producer or seller obtains the necessary export permits. Live fish
9	of such propagations may also be sold.
10	D. The Department shall establish a process to facilitate
11	broodstock transactions between the state and licensed in-state
12	aquatic propagators. The Department is authorized to assess a fee
13	necessary to maintain such process and the oversight required for
14	broodstock transactions. Fees imposed shall be reasonable,
15	accessible, and transparent, with clearly defined application
16	requirements, publicly available guidance, and established timelines
17	for application review and approval.
18	E. The state shall assess import fees for any entity selling
19	live fish within this state that does not possess a valid license
20	for commercial production of aquatic species issued by the Oklahoma
21	Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry along with an Oklahoma
22	address subject to regular inspections. Fees shall reflect the
23	costs in-state producers are subjected to when exporting to other

1	states. Each shipment shall include a valid Animal and Plant Health
2	Inspection Service health certificate.
3	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 2-115, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	Section 2-115. "Game fish" is a fish normally sought after by
6	sportsmen, and includes only largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, white
7	bass, spotted bass, black crappie, white crappie, northern pike,
8	trout, sauger, saugeye, striped bass, <u>hybrid striped bass,</u> walleye,
9	blue catfish and channel catfish. Blue catfish and channel catfish
10	are herein defined to mean "forked tail" catfish.
11	SECTION 3. REPEALER 29 O.S. 2021, Section 6-303.1, is
12	hereby repealed.
13	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
