15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-3-601 of Title 27A, unless  
18 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Urban  
20 Agriculture Cost Share Program".

21 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-3-602 of Title 27A, unless  
23 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 A. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission is hereby authorized to  
establish and administer an Urban Agriculture Cost Share Program as

1 funds become available. The Cost Share Program shall provide monies  
2 to eligible persons.

3 B. The purpose of the Urban Agriculture Cost Share Program is  
4 to promote sustainable urban agricultural practices, improve food  
5 security, and enhance green spaces in Oklahoma's urban areas.

6 C. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission Infrastructure  
7 Revolving Fund shall provide funding for the Urban Agriculture Cost  
8 Share Program. When sufficient funds are available in the Oklahoma  
9 Conservation Commission Infrastructure Revolving Fund, the  
10 Commission shall develop and disseminate the program guidelines to  
11 the conservation districts containing urban areas. The guidelines  
12 shall detail incentives to eligible persons for initiating and  
13 continuing urban agriculture initiatives.

14 D. To implement the program, the Commission shall require  
15 conservation districts to enter into contracts for eligible projects  
16 on eligible land detailing the eligible person's responsibilities.

17 E. For purposes of the Urban Agriculture Cost Share Program:

18 1. "Eligible person" means any individual, partnership,  
19 corporation, or legally recognized Indian tribe which shall include  
20 land held in trust, estate, or trust who as an owner, lessee,  
21 tenant, or operator participates in the care or management of land  
22 within a conservation district;

23 2. "Eligible land" means land that is within five (5) miles of  
24 an urban area that is:

- 1 a. privately owned land within the state,
- 2 b. land owned by the state or a political subdivision of
- 3 the state, or
- 4 c. lands temporarily owned by the United States or a
- 5 corporation wholly owned by it, which were not
- 6 acquired or reserved for conservation purposes,
- 7 including lands administered by the Farm Service
- 8 Agency, the U.S. Department of Defense, or by any
- 9 other government agency;

10 3. "Eligible projects" means urban agriculture projects that  
11 include, but are not limited to:

- 12 a. establishing or expanding community gardens in urban
- 13 neighborhoods,
- 14 b. rooftop and vertical farming,
- 15 c. installing greenhouses, high tunnels, or hoop houses
- 16 for food production,
- 17 d. installing rainwater harvesting systems and efficient
- 18 irrigation for urban farming,
- 19 e. enhancing soil health through composting and nutrient
- 20 management in urban areas,
- 21 f. establishing urban apiaries,
- 22 g. planting urban pollinator gardens,
- 23 h. building livestock infrastructure such as chicken
- 24 coops or goat enclosures,

- i. developing and implementing education programs on urban farming practices,
- j. creating, operating, and maintaining an urban food waste composting program,
- k. urban marketing initiatives for Oklahoma farms to sell in urban areas, and
- l. other projects that accomplish the objectives and purpose of this Cost Share Program; and

4. "Urban Area" means the areas in Oklahoma which have been defined by the United States Census Bureau as urban areas based on certain criteria and utilizing data from the most recent Federal Decennial Census.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-3-603 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

When developing the guidelines for an Urban Agriculture Cost Share Program, the Oklahoma Conservation Commission shall consider:

1. Prioritizing projects in geographic areas where residents have low levels of access to retail outlets selling healthy and affordable food;
2. Building on existing urban agriculture projects to continue to grow community engagement;

1 3. Reviewing approved cost-share methods available through  
2 USDA-NRCS to promote urban agriculture, improve urban food security,  
3 and enhance green spaces in urban areas; and

4 4. Evaluating if other federal, state, or Oklahoma tribal  
5 programs can be enhanced by the inclusion of practices in the  
6 Commission's Urban Agriculture Cost Share Program.

7 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-3-604 of Title 27A, unless  
9 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. The Conservation Commission shall require applicants to  
11 submit information, forms and reports as necessary to properly and  
12 efficiently administer the Urban Agriculture Cost Share Program.

13 B. Persons may apply to a conservation district for cost share  
14 funds for eligible urban agriculture initiatives in the State of  
15 Oklahoma, in accordance with the Cost Share Program year guidelines  
16 prepared yearly by the Commission. To be eligible for reimbursement  
17 for an urban agriculture cost share project, an eligible person  
18 shall:

19 1. Develop and file for review and approval with the  
20 conservation district a project plan that details the urban  
21 agriculture project plans, location of project, materials needed,  
22 expected expenditure, length of time expected to complete project  
23 construction, monitoring or operation plan if applicable, and  
24 expected community benefit of project; and

1           2. Enter into a contract with a conservation district detailing  
2 the responsibilities of the eligible person for the initial Cost  
3 Share Program year as well as any potential continuing  
4 responsibilities that are required to operate and maintain the  
5 project, if applicable.

6           C. Applications for funds shall be approved or denied by the  
7 conservation district in accordance with promulgated criteria  
8 prepared by the Commission.

9           SECTION 5.           NEW LAW           A new section of law to be codified  
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-3-605 of Title 27A, unless  
11 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12           Upon the conclusion of each Cost Share Program year, the  
13 Oklahoma Conservation Commission shall prepare and post on the  
14 agency website the statistical data for number and type of urban  
15 agriculture projects, funds expended, and urban community impacts by  
16 urban area of the cost share practices for that program year. This  
17 same information shall also be shared with the state cabinet  
18 Secretaries of Agriculture and Energy and Environment.

19           SECTION 6.           NEW LAW           A new section of law to be codified  
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-3-606 of Title 27A, unless  
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22           Nothing in this act or in the contract executed pursuant to  
23 Section 4 of this act shall be interpreted or construed to  
24 constitute a financial or general obligation of the state. No state

1 revenue shall be used to guarantee or pay for any damages to  
2 property or injury to persons as a result of the provisions of this  
3 act or the contract.

4 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 27A O.S. 2021, Section 3-2-110, is  
5 amended to read as follows:

6 Section 3-2-110. A. There is hereby created in the State  
7 Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission  
8 to be designated the "Oklahoma Conservation Commission  
9 Infrastructure Revolving Fund".

10 B. The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal  
11 year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the  
12 Oklahoma Conservation Commission from the apportionment of gross  
13 production tax revenues as prescribed by Section 1004 of Title 68 of  
14 the Oklahoma Statutes.

15 C. All monies accruing to the credit of said fund are hereby  
16 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma  
17 Conservation Commission for the purpose of the rehabilitation of  
18 watershed dams and~~7~~ for the Conservation Cost Share Program, the  
19 Urban Agriculture Cost Share Program, and the Conservation Reserve  
20 Enhancement Program.

21 D. Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon warrants  
22 issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by  
23 law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise  
24 Services for approval and payment.

1 E. No more than thirty percent (30%) of the monies in the fund  
2 shall be used for the payment of administrative expenses, salary or  
3 any other continuing obligation of the Oklahoma Conservation  
4 Commission; provided, however, such monies shall not be used for  
5 salary increases for employees.

6 SECTION 8. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
