This shall 8 include: 9 odor mitigation practices to be deployed to control a. 10 odor-emitting activities, sources, and locations, 11 how these practices will be utilized, and b. 12 during what times these practices will be utilized. с. 13 If a medical marijuana business receives three or more odor Β. 14 nuisance complaints within a thirty-day period, the business shall 15 be required to submit an odor control plan to the Authority. 16 С. The Authority shall promulgate rules as necessary to 17 implement the provisions of this section. 18 SECTION 2.
