**Research Analysis**

HB 1022 lowers the amount of assessment going to the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program Revolving Fund for violations of the failure to yield resulting in a fatality or great bodily injury from \$1,000 to \$500. The measure allows the assessment of a fee of \$500 to the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program Revolving Fund for persons convicted of failure to yield and who causes a serious bodily injury. The person may also be required to attend a remedial driving course, lose their license for up to 90 days, and pay restitution of not less than \$3,000 to \$10,000.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1022 reduces a certain fee for deposit into the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program Revolving Fund from \$1,000 to \$500. The measure also permits certain court imposed penalties in addition to the fee. After communication with the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety (DPS), a negative fiscal impact is not anticipated by reduction of the fee. Likewise, a positive fiscal impact is not anticipated because the measure does not provide fees or citations solely for failure to yield right-of-way. Rather, the measure provides such fees and penalties specifically for failure to yield right-of-way convictions which result in great or serious bodily injury, or fatality.
