**Research Analysis**

HB1730, as introduced, allows a retired court reporter to return to work with their former employer after 60 days of retirement and continue to receive their retirement benefits.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1730 allows retired court reporters to return to employment after 60 days of retirement and continue to receive retirement benefits with earnings limitations.

According to officials with the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System (OPERS), the measure incentivizes active members to potentially retire earlier than they would otherwise retire, causing the System to pay out more in retirement benefits. According to their actuaries, HB 1730 is very limited in scope, and it would be difficult to identify how many court reporters would return, thus making it difficult to calculate the cost of the changes. While it may have an impact, the actuaries do not anticipate the measure to have a meaningful impact on the Plan.
