**Research Analysis**

Engrossed SB 484 prohibits the governing body of a municipality with a population less than 300,000 from approving the proposal of a homeless shelter if it would be located within 3,000 feet of a school or school property. Any homeless shelter that was approved on the effective date of the measure is not subject to relocation or closure. The provisions of the measure do not apply to domestic violence shelters, youth shelters, or homeless shelters operated within a place of worship.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 484 relates to limitations on the distance between new homeless shelters to schools and school property. Specifically, the measure prohibits municipalities with populations of less than 300,000 from approving such proposals if the homeless shelter in question is located within 3,000 miles of such property. The measure deals exclusively with local municipal level government. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
