17	Section 601.1. A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma	
18	Commission on Children and Youth which shall be composed of <del>eighteen</del>

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- 4. One member appointed by the Governor who shall represent one of the metropolitan juvenile bureaus;
- 5. One member representing business or industry, appointed by the Governor;
- 6. One member who is the parent of a child with special needs, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 7. One member with a demonstrated interest in improving children's services who is not employed by a state agency or a private organization that receives state funds, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and
- 8. One member who shall be appointed by the Governor from a list of three names submitted by the Post Adjudication Review Board.
- B. The appointed members shall have had active experience in services to children and youth and may serve four terms of two (2) years each. A person appointed to fill the remainder of a vacant term shall, upon completion of that term, be eligible to serve four additional two-year terms. Terms shall coincide with the fiscal year.
- C. The Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth shall provide a report on Commission member attendance to the appointing authorities following each Commission meeting.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.

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
