B. A political advertisement, electioneering communication, or

distributed by a candidate, candidate committee, political action committee, or political party committee, as such terms are defined in Section 187 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and that contains an image, video, audio, text, or other digital content created in whole or in part with the use of generative artificial intelligence and appears to depict a real person performing an action that did not occur in reality, must prominently include the following disclosure: "Created in whole or in part with the use of generative artificial intelligence."

Such disclosure shall meet the following requirements:

- 1. For visual media, the text of the disclosure shall appear in a size that is easily readable by the average viewer. For video, the disclosure shall appear for the duration of the content created in whole or in part with the use of generative artificial intelligence; and
- 2. For media that is audio only, the disclosure shall be read in a clearly spoken manner and in a pitch that can be easily heard by the average listener at the beginning of the audio and at the end of the audio.
- C. A candidate whose appearance, action, or speech is depicted, in whole or in part, through the use of generative artificial intelligence may seek injunctive or other equitable relief prohibiting the publication of such depiction or may bring an action for general or special damages against the person or entity in

violation of subsection B of this section. The court may award a prevailing party court costs and reasonable attorney fees.

- D. The requirements of this section shall not apply to:
- 1. A radio or television broadcasting station, including a cable or satellite television operator, programmer, or producer, that broadcasts media created in whole or in part with the use of generative artificial intelligence as part of a bona fide newscast, news interview, news documentary, or on-the-spot coverage of bona fide news events, if the broadcast clearly acknowledges through content or a disclosure, in a manner that can be easily heard or read by the average listener or viewer, that there are questions about the authenticity of such media;
- 2. A radio or television broadcasting station, including a cable or satellite television operator, programmer, or producer, when it is paid to broadcast media created in whole or in part with the use of generative artificial intelligence and has made a goodfaith effort to establish that the depiction is not created in whole or in part with the use of generative artificial intelligence;
- 3. An internet website, or a regularly published newspaper, magazine, or other periodical of general circulation, including an internet or electronic publication, that routinely carries news and commentary of general interest, and that publishes media created in whole or in part with the use of generative artificial intelligence
