6	AS INTRODUCED
7	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or
9	rejection the repeal of Section 3 of Article VII-B of the Oklahoma Constitution, which relates to the Judicial Nominating Commission, and the proposed
10	amendment to Sections 1, 2, and 4 of Article VII-B of the Oklahoma Constitution; modifying applicability of
11	certain provisions; modifying definition; adding requirement for holding certain office; prohibiting
12	decrease of certain compensation; modifying certain appointment procedure; requiring Senate confirmation
13	of certain judicial appointments; providing ballot title; and directing filing.
14	
15	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
16	1ST SESSION OF THE 60TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
17	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
18	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
19	the repeal of Section 3 of Article VII-B and the following proposed
20	amendment to Sections 1, 2, and 4 of Article VII-B of the Oklahoma
21	Constitution to read as follows:
22	Section 1. (a) The <u>A. After November 5, 2025, the</u> provisions
23	of this Article shall govern the selection and tenure of all
24 27	Justices of the Supreme Court and Judges of the Court of Criminal

Appeals <u>and the Court of Civil Appeals</u> of the State of Oklahoma, to which the provisions hereof may be extended as hereinafter provided, other provisions of the Constitution or statutes of the State of Oklahoma to the contrary notwithstanding, and the provisions of Article VII as proposed by House Joint Resolution No. 508 of the First Session of the Thirty-first Oklahoma Legislature to the contrary notwithstanding.

(b) <u>B.</u> As used in this <u>Section Article</u>, "Judicial Office" means
the offices of Justice of the Supreme Court and Judges of the Court
of Criminal Appeals <u>and Court of Civil Appeals</u> and "Judicial
Officer" means a Justice or Judge of each such court, excluding
retired or supernumerary Justices or Judges.

13 Section 2. A. At the general election next before his or her 14 term expires, any Judicial Officer may seek retention in office by 15 filing with the Secretary of State, not less than sixty (60) days 16 before the date of such election, a declaration of candidacy to 17 succeed himself or herself. Thereupon, at such election, there 18 shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State, on a 19 separate ballot, without party designation, this question: 20 "Shall (Here insert name of Justice or Judge) of (Here 21 insert the title of the court) be retained in Office?" 22 🗆 YES 23 □ NO 24 27

1 The question shall be decided by a majority of those voting 2 If the decision is "yes" the Judicial Officer shall be thereon. 3 retained in office for the next ensuing six (6) year term. If the 4 decision is "no", or if no declaration of candidacy is filed, the 5 office shall be vacant upon expiration of the term then being 6 served, and the former Judicial Officer shall not be eligible for 7 appointment to succeed himself or herself. Retention in office may 8 be sought for successive terms without limit as to number, except 9 for retirement as may be provided by the Legislature for a maximum 10 retirement age.

¹¹ <u>B. Subject to paragraph c of Section 11 of Article VII of the</u> ¹² <u>Oklahoma Constitution, Judicial Officers appointed or retained</u> ¹³ <u>pursuant to this Article, after November 5, 2025, shall hold their</u> ¹⁴ <u>offices during good behavior, and shall, at stated times, receive</u> ¹⁵ <u>for their services, a compensation, which shall not be diminished</u> ¹⁶ during their continuance in office.

17 Section 4. When a vacancy in any Judicial Office, however 18 arising, occurs or is certain to occur, the Judicial Nominating 19 Commission shall choose and submit to the Governor and the Chief 20 Justice of the Supreme Court three (3) nominees, each of whom has 21 previously notified the Commission in writing that he will serve as 22 a Judicial Officer if appointed. The the Governor shall appoint one 23 (1) of the nominees to fill the vacancy, but if he fails to do so 24 within sixty (60) days the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall

1	appoint one (1) of the nominees, the appointment to be certified by
2	the Secretary of State nominate and, with the advice and consent of
3	the Senate, shall appoint all Judicial Officers. If the Senate is
4	not in session when a nomination is made, the Governor may call the
5	Senate into special session to advise and consent on any such
6	nomination.
7	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
8	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
9	the following form:

12	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
13	This measure would amend Article 7-B of the Oklahoma
14	Constitution. The measure would amend Sections 1, 2, and 4 of
15	Article 7-B to establish a new process for appointing Supreme
16	Court justices and judges of the Court of Criminal Appeals and
17	Court of Civil Appeals to reflect on the process established by
18	the United States Constitution. The Governor will nominate new
19	appellate justices and judges, subject to confirmation by the
20	Senate. Appellate justices and judges appointed or retained
21	after November 5, 2025, will serve during good behavior. The
22	measure would repeal Section 3 of Article 7-B which established
23	the Judicial Nominating Commission.
